Running Out of Oil?

No, this is not a political discourse on the condition of the world's oil supply. I'm referring to the oil that makes lights shine. Jesus told the parable of the five foolish maidens who did not prepare ahead of time by having extra oil for their lamps. They were waiting, with five others, to escort the bridegroom to the marriage. They didn't know when he would be coming and they went to sleep while waiting.



The bridegroom came and it was time for their lights to shine. But, the lamps of the foolish were growing dim and they had no more oil. They tried to borrow from the five who had extra oil but there was not enough to share. While the five foolish virgins ran in panic to find oil, the wedding party went into the house and the doors were shut.

You know the rest of the story - they were left out.

What about our story? Different people, yet similar circumstances. The Bridegroom is coming. There are those who are to be awaiting His coming. They are to shine as lights this time before He comes. They are to share their light with others. The lights burn – for awhile. He hasn't come. Some sleep. Lights burn low. Some are going out.

There are many people out there who need light to find their way in a dark world. Let's share what the Lord has given us.
